

**Mario Valle Dávila.** León Nicaragua, November 29, 1957. Son of Fernando Valle Arguello (Judge) and Maria Leticia Davila (first nurse graduate of Leon). At 7 years old his father died and his financial situation will degrade to the point of having to work and study to support her mother, who did double duty as nurse at the Hospital of the municipality to support her four children.

His primary and secondary were done at the Colegio La Salle. BS in Industrial Engineering from the National Engineering University (UNI) and has Masters in Business Administration at INCAE and Systems Engineering at the University of Science and Technology Latin American (ULACIT) in Costa Rica where he stood out as the best student of that program.

He has served as business manager of the textile and footwear sector in Nicaragua and Costa Rica as manager of supermarkets and food distributors.

In 1998 he founded the civic association, non-profit University of Managua (UdeM), with the aim of contributing to national development through training and attention to youth with limited economic resources. In just twelve years UdeM has become the largest private university in the country by the number of students (over 10,000 students), of which approximately 75% of these have some percentage of scholarship.

In 2006 he was elected to the National Assembly where it has maintained an independent stance and criticism of the government and opposition. He is Chairman of the Committee on Education, Sports, Culture and Media of the National Assembly and member of the Committee on Modernisation of the National Assembly. From the education commission has promoted laws of importance for the country as the Sign Language Act, the reform of the General Education Law and the Organic Law of the National Assessment and Accreditation (NCEA).

His performance in the organization, financing and support to sports activities in the country earned him the 2004 award for "sport of the year" by the Sports Journalists Association of Nicaragua (ACDN). In this area organized the international basketball tournament "William Ramirez in Memoriam" and is president of the Basketball Club Association of Nicaragua (ACB). The Association of Artists "Rafael Gastón Pérez" has acknowledged his support and care for the country's artists.

Since taking office as deputy donates his salary and his full quota of fuel to the underprivileged social sectors (taxi drivers, artists, victims of natural disasters affected the Nemagon, etc.).

Since 2009, he has collaborated with the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints as an opinion leader in the Day of blood donation that the organized church and in his capacity as Chairman of the Board of the University of Managua has supported joint activities such as the inauguration of Nicaragua's Basketball League in the ACB and the donation of school supplies at the National Institute for San Rafael del Sur.
