

### **Biographical Sketch – Zachary Calo**

Zachary Calo is Associate Professor of Law at the Valparaiso University School of Law, where he has taught since 2007. He previously practiced banking and commercial law in Washington, DC. He holds a J.D. from the University of Virginia School of Law, a B.A. and M.A. in History from The Johns Hopkins University, a Ph.D. in History from the University of Pennsylvania, and is a Ph.D. candidate (exp. 2011) in Religious Studies at the University of Virginia. He has been a visiting fellow at the Brookings Institution, the Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life, and the Institute for Humane Studies. He serves on the Organizing Committee of the AALS Law and Religion Section and is a member of the Editorial Board of the *European Journal of Law and Religion*. He is currently writing books on American Catholic social thought, Richard Hooker, human dignity and human rights, and law and secularism.
