

Biographical Sketch – Jeroen Temperman

Jeroen Temperman is assistant professor of public international law at the department of international of the Erasmus University Rotterdam, lecturing in International Human Rights Law and Public International Law.

In addition, Jeroen Temperman is the editor-in-chief of *Religion & Human Rights: An International Journal* (Martinus Nijhoff Publishers).

He completed his doctoral degree at the Irish Centre for Human Rights (National University of Ireland, Galway). He holds an LL.M from the Erasmus University Rotterdam, Netherlands; an E.MA (hons.) from the European Inter-University Centre for Human Rights and Democratisation, Venice, Italy; and an MA (hons.) from the University for Humanist Studies, Utrecht, Netherlands; he also holds undergraduate degrees in Law and Humanist Studies from the Erasmus University Rotterdam and the University for Humanist Studies respectively.

His publications are on contemporary issues of human rights law, particularly freedom of religion or belief, freedom of expression, religious hate speech, religion–state relationships, and issues of non-discrimination (on grounds of religion or belief).

In 2010, his monograph *State–Religion Relationships and Human Rights Law: Towards a Right to Religiously Neutral Governance* (Leiden/Boston: Martinus Nijhoff Publishers, 382 pp.) was published.

Other publications include articles on issues of religious freedom in such leading journals as *Human Rights Quarterly* (2009, 2010), *Netherlands Quarterly on Human Rights* (2008), *Annuaire Droit et Religion* (2009/2010), and *Religion & Human Rights* (2006, 2007, 2008); and chapters in leading edited volumes on religious freedom, such as the recent compendium *Religion and Human Rights: Critical Concepts in Religious Studies* (ed. Nazila Ghanea) and the forthcoming volume *Law and Religion in the 21st Century: Relations between States and Religious Communities* (ed. Silvio Ferrari).
