

## RAYMOND COHEN

Raymond Cohen is a graduate of Oxford University and received his Ph.D. from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, where he has been on the department's faculty since 1976.

Dr. Cohen has been a visiting professor at the University of British Columbia and Georgetown University and a research fellow at the U.S. Institute of Peace and the Watson Institute for International Studies at Brown University. Dr. Cohen's fields of interest are cross-cultural communication, diplomacy in ancient times, conflict resolution and the Christian holy places.

He is the author of several books and articles and has two books due out soon: "Saving the Holy Sepulchre: How Rivals Restored the Church of the Resurrection," Oxford University Press; and "Isaiah's Vision of Peace in Biblical and Modern International Relations: Swords into Plowshares," ed. with Raymond Westbrook, Palgrave Macmillan.
