

## MARIA COUROUCLI

Maria Couroucli (BA and MA Cantab; PhD, Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales, HDR Université Paris Ouest) is Senior Researcher at the CNRS. She has published a monograph on kinship and social organization of an olive-growing village community in Corfu (cf. *Les oliviers du lignage*, Maisonneuve et Larose, Paris 1985). She has carried further research in Greece on kinship and family, identity and nationalism. Her more recent research concerns shared religious practices in the post-ottoman world (cf. Albera and Couroucli (eds) *Religions Traversées*, Actes Sud, 2009) and her work in progress *-Remembering and forgetting the Greek civil war (1945-49)-* is focused on questions of memory, combining ethnography and archival work. She teaches in the post-graduate program of the Departement d'Ethnologie et de Sociologie comparative at Nanterre University (Paris, France) and is member of the editorial board of *Ethnologie Française*. She is currently Director of Modern Greek and Balkan Studies at the Ecole Française d'Athènes ([www.efa.gr](http://www.efa.gr)).
