

LAURENCE PAUL HEMMING

Laurence Paul Hemming is since August 2010 a member of the Department of Organisation, Work and Technology of the Lancaster University Management School, Bailrigg, Lancaster, where he is Research Fellow, working to develop a series of internally and externally funded research projects, with teaching and lecturing at the postgraduate level. He is currently lecturing under the School's Distinguished Scholar's Scheme.

He holds a Ph.D., University of Cambridge (Peterhouse) 1999; M.Phil., University of Oxford; B.A. (M.A.) in Philosophy and Theology, University of Oxford (Oriental College).

From 2008 to July 2010, he was a Research Fellow in the Faculty of Arts and Sciences and the Management School at the Institute for Advanced Studies, Lancaster University, County South, Lancaster, where he developed a series of research projects, with teaching and lecturing at the postgraduate level. From 2007-2008 he provided support and assistance in research teaching and provision for the School of Theology, Philosophy and History, St. Mary's University College, London. Concurrently he offered some research teaching at University College London for the Philosophy Department intercollegiate philosophy programme and supervised research students for the University of London PhD.

From 1998 – 2007 he was at Heythrop College, University of London, where he was Research Fellow (1998-1999), Lecturer in Theology (1999-2000), Assistant Dean of Research Students (2000-2001), Dean of Research Students (2001-2004), and Dean of Research (2004-2007). During this time he taught, supervised, and examined at all levels in the College from undergraduate to research students and had oversight of all policies relating to staff and student research, and overall responsibility for the College's research strategy.

In 2002-2001 he was a research fellow and guest professor at Catholic University of Louvain, where he was a member of the *Research Group: Theology in a Postmodern Context*. His research resulted in the book *Devaluing God: Postmodernity's Transcending* (SCM Press and Notre Dame University Press 2005).

Hemming is editor of two book series, one for T&T Clark and one for Notre Dame University Press. He is editor of a peer-reviewed academic journal (Maney Publications) and is a member of external validation panels for various institutions. Works in Latin, Ancient Greek, German, French, some Dutch and Italian and is learning Russian.

Professor Hemming is the author or editor of eight books and numerous articles, including a number of works on Heidegger, most recently *Heidegger and Marx: A Productive Dialogue over the Language of Humanism* (Northwestern University Press 2012) and *The Movement of Nihilism: Heidegger's Thinking after Nietzsche* (Editor with Bogdan Costea and Kostas Amiridis in the series Continuum Studies in Continental Philosophy (Continuum Books, Ltd. 2011).
