Dr. Ofrit Liviatan is a lecturer at Harvard University's Department of Government, and an associate of the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University. She co-chairs Harvard's Seminar on Religion and Politics.

Dr. Liviatan holds a PhD and MA (with distinction) from the Fletcher School of Law And Diplomacy at Tufts University and an Israeli law degree. She was admitted to the Israel Bar and practiced law in Israel, specializing in constitutional, criminal and commercial litigation.

Dr. Liviatan's research interests include: Law and politics; tensions between legal theory and practice; the role of legal systems in the accommodation of diversity; and religion and state.
