

FABRIZIO MARRELLA

Fabrizio Marrella is professor of International Law at Cà Foscari University of Venice, where he teaches the courses of Advanced International Law as well as International and European Business Law. He is presently the Dean of the Human Rights Village (HRV), a project of the European Inter-university Center for Human rights and Democratisation (EIUC), a consortium of 41 Universities from all Europe aiming at becoming a Centre of excellence in the world for an holistic model of teaching, training, research, advocacy, counselling, advice in International Law, Human Rights, Democratisation, Peace, Justice, Democracy, Sustainable Development as well as other interrelated issues. He is also the chairperson of the Laurea Magistrale in International Relations (second cycle degree programme) of "Cà Foscari" University of Venice within its School of International Relations.

Since 2010, Prof. Marrella has been appointed *Professeur-Chercheur Associé* at the *Institut de Recherche en Droit International et Européen de La Sorbonne* (IREDIÉS, Université de Paris I - Panthéon Sorbonne) in Paris, France.

He was, from August 2008 until July 2011, the European Programme Director of the E.MA Programme in Human Rights and Democratisation of EIUC where he was a member of the Board of Directors since its foundation (in 2002) until 2008.

On 20 may 2008, Prof. Marrella received from the Curatorium of The Hague Academy of International Law the official invitation to deliver his course in 2013 in the section of Private International Law.

Before returning to Venice, his home town, he was formerly Adjunct Professor of International Trade Law at the IHEAL (Institute for Advanced Studies on Latin America) of the Université de Paris III-La Sorbonne Nouvelle and Lecturer at the *Institut de Droit Comparé de Paris* (Université de Paris II-Panthéon Assas). In 2006 he was *professeur invité* at the Université de Strasbourg. In 2007 and 2008, Prof. Marrella has served as vice-Director of the Harvard University-Venice program where he has taught Introduction to International Business Law.

Prof. Marrella holds the highest Doctorates in Law with top grades from the University of Paris I Panthéon Sorbonne and the University of Bologna, as well as the Diploma from The Hague Academy of International Law. He is fluent in English, French, Spanish and Italian.

Prof. Marrella has participated in international symposia and has given invited lectures in numerous venues.
